

**IGWG Questionnaire Results- Summary**  
**April 1, 2011**

**Please note:** This is based on 49 responses from the 1,200 IGWG listserv members

**Member Profile:**

- 67 percent located in Washington, DC
- Majority work for NGOs/non-profits or are independent consultants
- Most focus on gender-based violence, however, many indicated that they also focus on family planning, reproductive health, HIV/AIDS, and policy advocacy

**Events Feedback:**

- Over 80 percent frequently or sometimes attend events
- The majority find events useful for sharing information, new research, and networking
- Technical updates are considered the most useful events, followed by panels, then brown bags

**Resources Feedback:**

- Over 90 percent frequently or sometimes access resources or information on the IGWG website
- The most common resources used on the website are publications, followed by gender news, then events and training

**Role and Topics Feedback:**

- Over 80 percent believe the right amount of emphasis is on gender-based violence.
- The following topics are identified as important to highlight:
  - Gender-Based Violence (59%)
  - Family Planning/Reproductive Health (49%)
  - Economic Empowerment (46%)
  - Maternal Health (40%)
  - HIV/AIDS (34%)
- Gaps in the topics are rated as:
  - Policy Implications
  - Monitoring and Evaluating
  - Gender and Agriculture
  - Male Involvement
  - Youth
- Suggested ways to better serve members are:
  - Create a portal for feedback on the website
  - Create database with all the gender news clips
  - Create subgroups or working groups/taskforces
  - Host more web-based events for those outside of Washington, DC
  - Host more brown bags and panels
